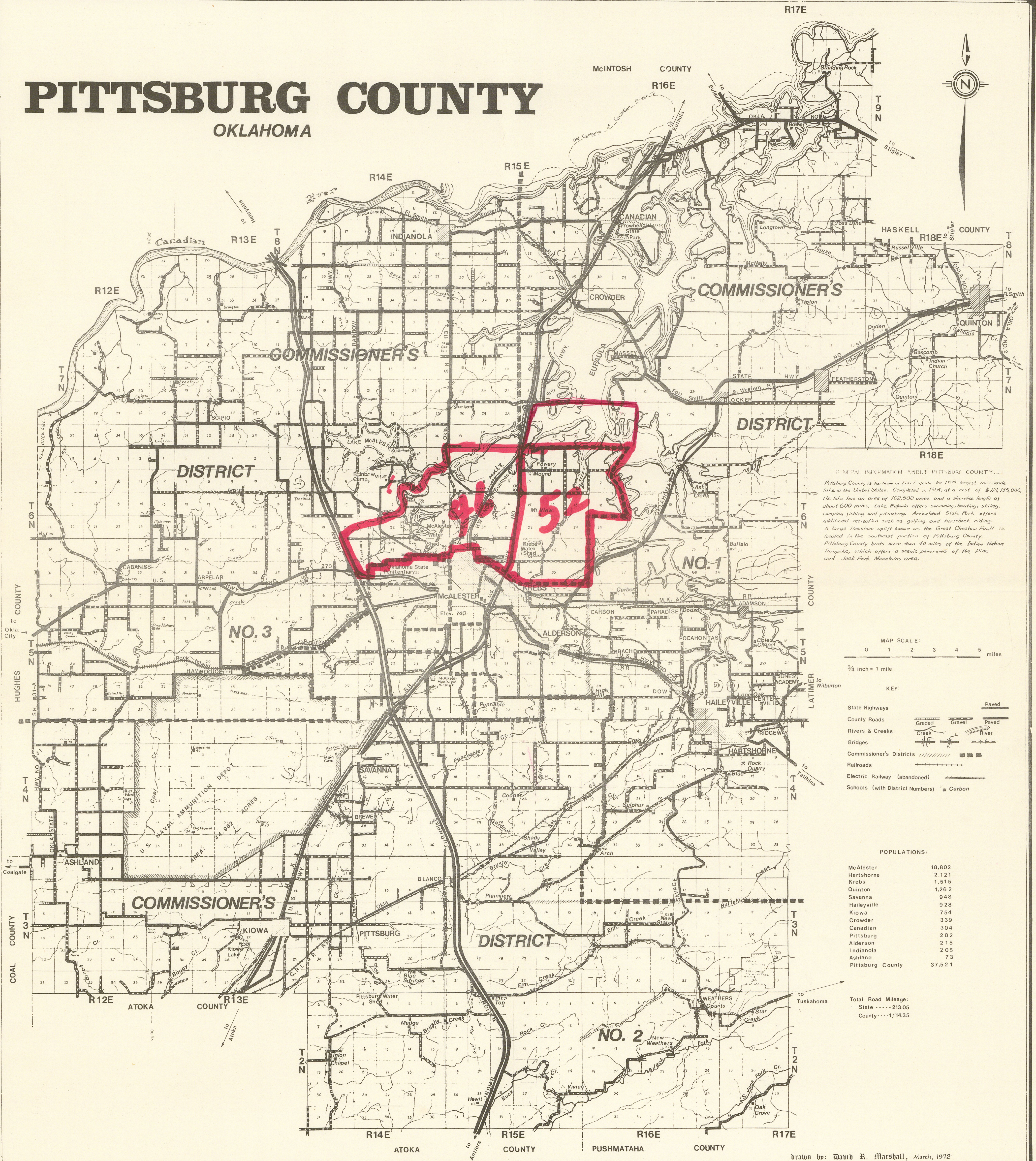


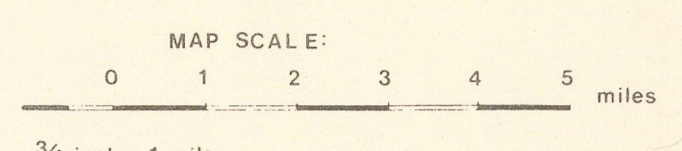

GENERAL INFORMATION ABOUT PITTSBURG COUNTY...

Pittsburg County is the home of Lake Eufaula, the 15th largest man-made lake in the United States. Completed in 1964, at a cost of \$121,735,000, the lake has an area of 102,500 acres and a shoreline length of about 600 miles. Lake Eufaula offers swimming, boating, skiing, camping, fishing and picnicking. Arrowhead State Park offers additional recreation such as golfing and horseback riding. A large limestone uplift known as the Great Chestnut Fault is located in the southeast portion of Pittsburg County. Pittsburg County hosts more than 40 miles of the Indian Nation Turnpike, which offers a scenic panorama of the Pine and Jack Fork Mountains area.
