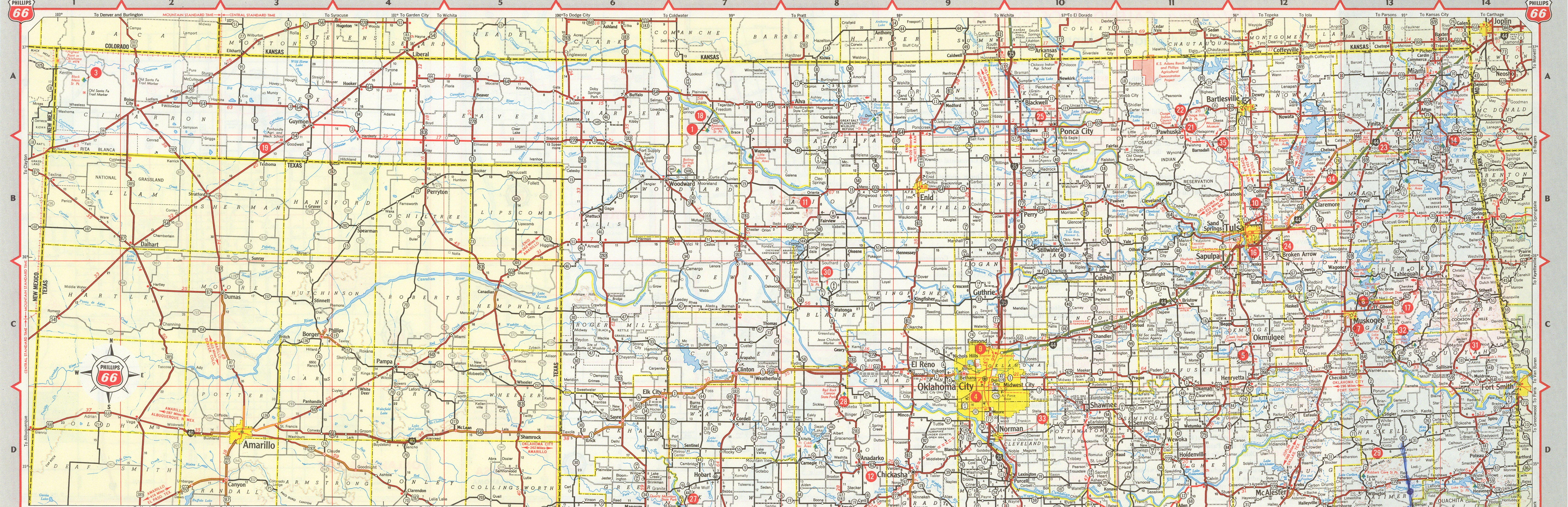




Oklahoma POINTS OF INTEREST

- **Locations on Camp shown by grid coordinates, totals:**
 - ① **Alabaster Caverns State Park.** The park's central feature is one of the largest gypsum caves in the world. Its tunnels and galleries form an underground wonderland of all shapes and sizes. (C-12)
 - ② **Beavers Bend State Park.** Clear Mountain Fork River tumbles between high and rugged banks in this beautiful region of unspoiled nature. The scenic park boasts a variety of plant and animal life. (F-14)
 - ③ **Black Mesa State Park.** Rising to a height of 4,975 feet, this park is one of the highest in Oklahoma. Indian petroglyphs, dinosaur pits, and unusual rock formations are found within the park area. (A-17)
 - ④ **Capitol Building.** Completed in 1917, this state capitol is constructed of white limestone on a base of Oklahoma granite. The building is surrounded by large Oklahoma trees. (C-13)
 - ⑤ **Creek Indian Council House.** The old building, which was the Council House for the Creek Indian Nation, is a historical museum. Outstanding exhibits of Indian history, arts, crafts, and culture are displayed. (C-13)
 - ⑥ **Devil's Den.** Many curious and interesting rock formations may be seen in this rugged boulder-strewn cavern. A creek flows over rapids and falls within the natural park setting. (E-14)
 - ⑦ **Fork Gibson.** Built in 1822, the old frontier outpost Fork Gibson was used and added to during the Civil War. Its old stockade has now been restored to the original appearance. (C-13)
 - ⑧ **Grandfather Dam and Reservoir.** A large dam divides the Grand River to form scenic Fork Gibson Reservoir. Parks and recreational areas are found around this park for its excellent fishing. (C-13)
 - ⑨ **Frontier City.** A reproduction of a pioneer town of late 1800's depicts life during the frontier. Many colorful scenes of frontier existence have been authentically recreated. (C-9)
 - ⑩ **Gilcrease Museum.** On a hill overlooking Tulsa, this museum displays many significant exhibits of Indian history, arts and culture. It is noted as an outstanding library of Indian material. (H-12)
 - ⑪ **Grand Staircase-Escalante National Monument.** The mountains are covered with tiny sparkling selenite crystals. Gradual erosion here has formed many unusual and interesting rock formations. (B-8)

- ① **Indian City, U.S.A.** Authentic reproductions of Indian villages depict the life and culture of the American Indians. An interesting museum houses fine exhibits of Indian relics and artifacts. (B-12)
- ② **Lake Murray State Park.** A beautifully colorful region on the shores of Lake Murray, the park is an outstanding recreational area. Water sports, fishing, riding or hiking are among the most popular activities. (F-10)
- ③ **Lake O' the Cherokees.** Often called Grand Lake, National Park of the Cherokees provides an outstanding resort region. Hunting, camping, fishing and boating may all be enjoyed by the visitor. (A-13)
- ④ **Lake Texoma State Park.** This scenic park, on the shores of huge Lake Texoma, provides a popular recreation area. In addition to the many water sports, visitors may enjoy fishing, swimming and boating. (B-12)
- ⑤ **Municipal Rose Garden.** Thousands of magnificent roses bloom in a terraced six-acre garden in Woodward Park. It has been chosen as an official guest garden by the All-American Rose Selections Committee. (B-15)
- ⑥ **Marshall Mission.** Built in 1842, this magnificent structure is the oldest of its kind in the region. The mission during Civil War days. Signs of significant historical interest, the old building has been restored. (C-13)
- ⑦ **Natural Bridge.** Eroded by ancient rushing waters from a barrier of solid granite, the bridge arches 150 feet above the canyon floor. Its top offers a splendid view of other natural formations. (B-12)
- ⑧ **No-Man's Land Museum.** Located on the campus of the Panhandle A. & M. College, the museum features exhibits of relics of the Southwest. Interesting displays emphasize the history and development of the panhandle region. (B-3)
- ⑨ **Old Fort Huachuca.** The ruins of a Spanish mission and the old guardhouse in which the famed warrior Geronimo was imprisoned. The aging building now houses a museum containing both military and Indian relics. (F-8)
- ⑩ **Osaage Hills State Park.** A favorite retreat for outlaws during the territorial days, this region contains a great natural attraction. The park is a beautiful area of Clear Sand Creek winds throughout the lovely park. (A-11)
- ⑪ **Osaage Indian Council House.** At the foot of Agency Hill stands the old Osaage Council House, now the City Hall. Nearby an interesting museum displays exhibits of Osaage history and culture. (A-11)
- ⑫ **Panhandle Dam.** Started in 1938, 6,565-foot-long Pensacola Dam is one of the longest multiple-dam dams in the world. Built on the Grand River, it impounds waters which form scenic Lake O' the Cherokees. (B-13)
- ⑬ **Philbrook Art Center Museum.** Formerly a beautiful home, the museum houses an excellent collection of oil paintings. An extensive collection of Southwestern Indian lore may be seen in this fine center. (B-12)
- ⑭ **Pioneer Woman State Monument.** The bronze statue of the Pioneer Woman memorializes the hardy courage of the women who helped to settle Oklahoma. Close by is the interesting Pioneer Woman Museum. (A-10)
- ⑮ **Prairie View State Park.** A beautiful area of natural springs, this beautiful park is located in a wooded area of cascading streams. It is particularly lovely in April when the redbud trees are in bloom. (E-10)
- ⑯ **Quartz Mountain State Park.** Bordering on Lake Albus, this scenic park offers the beauty of rugged granite hills and a variety of wooded valleys. Typically Western plants and animals are found in the picturesque region. (D-7)
- ⑰ **Red Rock Canyon State Park.** Spectacular stone cliffs surround the picturesque canyon floor in this colorful park. Swimming and picnicking facilities are found near the towering red-rudd canyon walls. (D-8)
- ⑱ **Rocky Mountain State Park.** Large wooded streams, canyons, and pine-covered hills in this way winds by streams, animals. Robbers Cave is said to have been a hideout for famous outlaws during the early days. (D-13)
- ⑲ **Roman Nose State Park.** Surrounded by open prairie, the rolling hills of this region are cut by canyons and streams. Nearby is the Cheyenne River Indian Reservation. The park is an excellent recreational area. (C-8)
- ⑳ **Sequoyah's Home.** The small log cabin home of Sequoyah, inventor of the Cherokee alphabet, is enshrined within a larger stone building. A museum here displays mementoes of the famous Indian of the Cherokee. (C-14)
- ㉑ **Shawnee State Park.** The rolling hills and wooded hills surround this enchanting, clear blue lake. Extending for 30 miles in the Cookson Hills the reservoir is noted as an excellent fishing area. (C-13)
- ㉒ **University of Oklahoma Museum.** Located on the University campus, this excellent museum contains many fine exhibits. The University Museum of paleontology is particularly outstanding. (D-9)
- ㉓ **Will Rogers Memorial.** Will Rogers is buried near a memorial that stands where he had long planned to build a home. In the memorial building, a gallery displays mementoes of the famous humorist. (B-12)
- ㉔ **Woolacore Museum.** Located on the Frank Phillips Ranch, the museum contains outstanding collections of Western paintings and relics. Displays feature the history of man with particular emphasis on the story of the Southwest. (A-11)
