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SUBJECT: ORIEGA'S PRESS CONFERENCE AFTER CODEL LEAVES

GIVES A DIFFERENT SLANT TO DEMOCRACY

REF: MANAGUA 3690

- 1. (U) NICERASUAN PRESIDENT DANIEL ORTEGA WAITED UNTIL AFTER HIS MEETING WITH CODEL MCCURDY (SEPTEL) TO MAKE SEVERAL UNFLATIEFING COMPARISONS BETWEEN NICARAGUAN AND AMERICAN DEMOCRACY. AT HIS MEETING WITH THE CODEL, ORTEGA HAD MENTIONED ONLY "COSTA RICAN," OR "OTHER CENTRAL AMERICAN" MODELS OF DEMOCRACY. IN A FRESS CONFERENCE HELD AFTER THE CODEL LEFT NICARAGUA, WHICH AFPEARED IN BARRI-CADA OF JUNE 3, CRIEGA COMPARED NICARAGUA'S "OPEN DOOR" DEMOCRACY WITH THE MORE LIMITED VERSION EXISTING IN THE U.S., AND SAID, "WE WISH THE UNITED STATES HAD THIS KIND OF DEMOCRACY. " CRIEGA ALSO WISHED THAT PRESIDENT REAGAN WOULD MEET WITH MEMBERS OF THE NICARAGUAN NATIONAL ASSEMBLY AND ALLOW THEM "TO QUESTION HIM," THE WAY HE (ORTEGA) HAD MET WITH THE CODEL. DRIEGA ACCUSED THE US OF TRYING TO IMPOSE ITS "MODEL" OF DEMOCRACY ON NICARAGUA, A CHARGE HE HAD LEVELED ONLY AT HIS CENTRAL AMERICAN NEIGHBORS WHEN TALKING WITH CODEL MCCURDY.
- 2. (U) CRIEGA RESPONDED TO A QUESTION ABOUT THE NICARAGUAN ACQUISITION OF COMBAT AIRCRAFT, ONE OF THE MEAPONS SYSTEMS HE TOLD THE CODEL NICARAGUA WOULD BE WILLING TO LIMIT, BY SAYING THAT THE GON IS CONTEMPLATING THE ACQUISITION OF SUCH AIRCRAFT, AND THAT THE DECISION AS TO WHAT MODEL TO ACQUIRE "WILL DEPEND ON THE GOVERNMENT THAT SUPPLIES THEM."
- 3. (J) ON CONTADORA, ORTEGA CLAIMED THAT WHEN THE NICA-RAGUAN GOVERNMENT PRESENTED "CONCRETE PROPOSALS" ON ARMS, THE US WAS LEFT WEAPONLESS TO CONTINUE OPPOSING THE CONTADORA PROCESS, AND SO TURNED TO THE THEME OF DEMOCRACY IN ORDER TO DISRUPT NEGOTIATIONS. NEVERTHELESS, INSISTED CRIEGA, NICARAGUA IS WILLING TO CONTINUE NEGOTIATING.
- 4. (C) THIS IS NOT WHAT ORTEGA SAID TO THE CODEL. ORTEGA HAD TOLD THE REPRESENTATIVES THAT THE SPEECH CRITICIZING NICARAGUA GIVEN TO THE CAS BY PRESIDENT AZCONA DID HOT REFLECT HIS (AZCONA'S) TRUE FEELINGS, BUT FATHER HIS NEED TO REMAIN IN THE GOOD GRACES OF THE U.S. FEPRESENTATIVE EOUCHER, USING ORTEGA'S OWN HORDS, THEN ASPED IF, GIVEN ORTEGA'S NEED TO PLACATE HIS SOVIET AND CUEAN ALLIES, HE WAS TELLING THE CODEL "WHAT WAS IN HIS HEART." ORTEGA DID NOT RESPOND DIRECTLY TO THE OUESTION, BUT JUDGING FROM HIS REMARKS IN BARRICADA, HIS ANSWER SHOULD HAVE BEEN "NO."
