

#### CLIMATOLOGY

Washington, DC: Summertime temperatures retain June accompanied by partly to mostly sunny skies and higher humidity. The average high temperature is 84F, although temperatures exceed 9 on eight days. The average low temperature is 65F. Showers or thunderstorms occur on about sidays during the month. The mean relative humid continues to increase during the month causing considerable discomfort on occasion.

Guatemala City, Guatemala: The relatively high elevation (almost 5,000 feet) modifies temperatu during June. The average daily temperatures ran from a low of 60F to a high in the mid 70s. Precitation is frequent and abundant, occurring on two of every three days and resulting in over 10 inche for the month.

Managua, Nicaragua: Hot, humid weather with frequent showers and thunderstorms is the rule during June, the rainiest month. Temperatures range from an average daily low of 73F to a high the upper 80s. The high temperatures combined with a mean relative humidity of 82% results in a uncomfortable climate. Rain usually occurs on 1 days during the month for a total accumulation of over eight inches.

San Jose, Costa Rica: The 3,000 foot elevation modifies the climate during June. Daily tempera tures range from a low in the lower 60s to a high the upper 70s. Showers are frequent, occurring of 70% of the days and resulting in almost 10, inches of rain for the month.

Panama City, Panama: Hot, humid weather with frequent showers and thunderstorms dominates th climate in June. Average daily temperatures range between the mid 70s and upper 80s. Precipitation occurs on two of every three days, producing almost eight inches of rain for the month. The high temperatures and an average relative humidity of 829 results in a generally uncomfortable climate.
