My dear Mr. Thomas:

Under the law each Member of Congress is entitled to two copies of each map and folio published by the Geological Survey during his term of office. Topographic maps and geologic folios covering areas in which you are not interested may be exchanged for similar maps and folios which you or your constituents may want. Your allotment for 1924 gives you a credit of 272 topographic maps and 4 geologic folios. You may order the full allotment, choosing one or more of any of the maps or folios already published, or you may let your allotment stand and draw on it from time to time, as long as you remain in Congress.

For your convenience I am inclosing an index map circular showing the areas in your State for which maps or folios have been published. The maps or folios indicated are parts of the topographic or geologic atlas of the United States, which the Geological Survey has been engaged in making practically since its organization in 1879.
